Dear Scott:

This letter agreement will serve to memorialize our understanding and agreement between you, Scott Tindale, and MyGlobalClassroom, Inc. (a California nonprofit 501(c)(3) corporation regarding your participation and services as a Writer on the production of a 20-minute short film, and, more specifically, your services as the Writer of Episode #1, entitled "Perfectly Normal," as part of the MyGlobalClassroom Storytelling Fellowship.

It is agreed that you shall receive compensation in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for said episode, fifty-percent (50%) to be paid upon execution of this agreement, with the remaining fifty-percent (50%) to be paid upon delivery of the script.

You shall also receive on-screen credit at the back of the episode (a single card credit) and be listed on the company IMDb page as the Writer of said episode.

It is understood that your work may be rewritten, edited or otherwise modified at the sole discretion of the Executive Producer, but that you will still receive sole writer's credit for the episode. Should you decide that you wish to have your name removed from the episode for any reason, you must inform the Executive Producer in writing before said episode is filmed. Additionally, there is no guarantee that your script will be used

at all, modified or otherwise. Notwithstanding, you will still receive compensation under the aforementioned terms and conditions.

Your work on this episode as part of the MyGlobalClassroom Storytelling Fellowship shall constitute a "work made for hire" and MyGlobalClassroom, Inc. shall own and control the copyright to said work.

Until a more formal agreement is entered into between the parties, this letter agreement shall constitute the entire agreement. This agreement cannot be changed orally; any changes must be made in writing.

If any portion of this letter agreement shall be deemed invalid by a court of law, the other portions of the agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

This agreement is subject to the laws of the State of California.

30 Story Subject Ideas

Entertainment-first concepts for short comedic/dramatic films aimed at kids and teens

1. The Group Chat

A harmless meme about a classmate spirals into a brutal overnight pile-on when nobody wants to be the first person to say, "This isn't funny anymore."

Theme: online bullying, peer pressure, courage

2. The Bench

A new student sits alone every day at lunch. Two socially terrified kids compete with each other to avoid being the one who talks to him first.

Theme: inclusion, loneliness, fear of rejection

3. The Joke

A popular kid gets laughs doing impressions of a teacher's accent until he accidentally humiliates his best friend's immigrant father at a school event.

Theme: casual racism, empathy, accountability

4. Perfectly Normal

A girl works desperately to hide the fact that her family lives in a motel after losing their apartment.

Theme: poverty stigma, identity, shame

5. The Backup Player

A disabled student joins the school esports team and turns out to be better than everyone else – but his teammates only want him hidden "behind the scenes."

Theme: disability inclusion, tokenism

6. The Apology Video

After a cruel prank goes viral, three students attempt to film an apology video together – but each has a completely different idea of what accountability means.

Theme: consequences, performance remorse

7. Grandma's Uber

A mortified middle-schooler is forced to let his loud, opinionated grandmother drive him to school for a month.

Theme: ageism, family embarrassment, generational understanding

8. Invisible Captain

A shy girl secretly runs every successful school event while louder students take all the credit.

Theme: overlooked kids, self-worth

9. The Birthday Invite

A boy realizes nobody invited the weird kid in class to his birthday party – because everyone assumed someone else would.

Theme: exclusion through passivity

10. Wrong Table

A student accidentally sits with another social group at lunch one day and discovers they're nothing like the stereotypes everyone repeats.

Theme: cliques, assumptions

11. The Translator

A bilingual kid becomes the unofficial translator for his immigrant parents everywhere they go and secretly resents it.

Theme: family pressure, cultural identity

12. The Rumor Account

An anonymous gossip page starts exposing students' secrets. Everyone hates it – until their own secret becomes the next post.

Theme: cyberbullying, mob mentality

13. Costume Day

A student wears what he thinks is a funny costume to school and slowly realizes it's offensive for reasons he never considered.

Theme: cultural sensitivity, ignorance vs malice

14. The New Coach

A funny, unconventional coach forces rival social groups to work together during a disaster of a season.

Theme: teamwork, prejudice, unlikely friendships

15. The Talent Show

Two students from opposite worlds reluctantly team up for the school talent show because neither can perform alone.

Theme: social division, connection

16. Filtered

A girl obsessed with appearing perfect online panics when classmates discover what her real life actually looks like.

Theme: authenticity, social media pressure

17. The Mispronunciation

A teacher repeatedly mispronounces a student's name despite constant corrections, leading the student to finally stop correcting anyone.

Theme: identity, invisibility, respect

18. Team Mom

An over-involved parent embarrasses her child so badly at games that the kid starts pretending not to know her.

Theme: family dynamics, empathy

19. The Substitute

A substitute teacher unexpectedly connects with the class because he treats them like intelligent people instead of problems.

Theme: respect, emotional honesty

20. Copy/Paste

A student copies another kid's slang, style, and cultural identity for popularity without understanding what any of it means.

Theme: appropriation, identity performance

21. The Lunch Debt

A student quietly racks up unpaid lunch debt and becomes the subject of gossip after cafeteria workers cut him off.

Theme: poverty, humiliation, dignity

22. The Scholarship Kid

A working-class student at an elite private school becomes the accidental mascot for "diversity" while feeling completely isolated.

Theme: class division, belonging

23. Voice Notes

A misunderstanding escalates because nobody talks face-to-face anymore – only through texts, screenshots, and voice notes.

Theme: communication, online conflict

24. The Prank War

Two best friends push their escalating prank war too far and accidentally target a student who already feels invisible.

Theme: unintended cruelty

25. The Fake Tough Guy

A feared bully turns out to be terrified of being exposed as emotionally vulnerable.

Theme: toxic masculinity, insecurity

26. The Audition

A student with severe anxiety secretly has an incredible singing voice but sabotages every audition to avoid being seen.

Theme: mental health, fear, self-acceptance

27. The Volunteer

Students volunteer at a senior center for extra credit and discover the residents are funnier, wilder, and more emotionally honest than expected.

Theme: empathy across generations

28. The "Normal" Family

A kid obsessed with having a "normal family" slowly realizes every family his friends have is chaotic in different ways.

Theme: acceptance, identity

29. The Empty Seat

After a student suddenly leaves school, classmates argue over why nobody noticed how isolated he had become.

Theme: invisibility, community responsibility

30. The Crossing Guard

A sarcastic crossing guard becomes the unlikely confidant for students dealing with fights, secrets, heartbreak, and social drama every morning before school.

Theme: listening, kindness, unseen adults
